Mr Williams, having a pair of strong shoes with nails in them, which would hold their footing better than mine, requested to make the first attempt, and after some difficulty he succeeded... When he had fixed himself securely to a part of the rock, he took off his belt and holding it firmly by one end, gave the other to me: I laid hold, and, with a little aid from the stones, fairly pulled myself up by it. After this we got on pretty well, and in about an hour and a quarter from the commencement of our labour, we found ourselves upon the brow of this dreadful precipice, and in possession of all the plants we expected to find."</i> (The Revd W Bingley)

"After an hour or two spent on more or less unprofitable inspection on the face of Clogwyn Du'r Arddu, its Eastern Gully appeared to offer the best route in the direction of Clogwyn y Ddysgl. The direct finish to the gully was taken as its natural termination in preference to the soft option on the left, from a sense of duty and in ignorance of its evil reputation. The character of the first 20 or 30 feet is certainly indefensible, and owing to the extreme steepness of the angle, the ascent of this section without reliable holds proved a severe test of the leader's skill and the writer's patience. But above this, although much of the rock seemed to be the masonry of a pastry cook, it provided a sufficiency of sound holds..." (R Todhunter on the first ascent)

"The route may have been climbed earlier by O G Jones: To the left of the Eastern Cliff there is a wide, open gully which bends to the right and narrows down to the thinnest of cracks at a point 200 feet below the top of the cliff. There is a rumour that O G Jones climbed this fearsome looking and loose section, but the writer has more respect for the memory of his friend and his sound judgment than to agree with this.

The view downward into this Eastern Gully from the top of the cliff which overhangs its right wall is one of the most thrilling sights in Snowdonia."

(G D Abraham) This last quotation gives an insight into the psyche and ethics of these early climbers who did not wish to appear in any way reckless. While it may seem hopelessly conservative now, they were often condemned for their wilful neglect of safety then.

"Our leader having arrived exhausted at this point stood up on the ledge and called for a man with guts. Having none to spare we sent up two chockstones slung in a handkerchief, one of which he inserted in the crack above and secured himself by passing his rope through six feet of Beale. This noose and our blessings enabled him to leave the crack and climb a steep little wall on the right, then swing onto a shelf.

"1st Ascent Classification: Severe, probably 'Very Severe' at present... Pitch 5. Second join leader. This 10-foot corner is without useful holds and unsuitable for backing up. The leader used the second's shoulders until he could grasp the ledge below the grass fringe. The second then gradually rises from his knees giving the leader sufficient support for him to effect a landing in the Conservatory, a big grass platform which now has a wooden (broomstick) piton in the wall at the back. A safe manoeuvre only for two steady climbers." (L Henshaw, FA)

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"Longland had meanwhile with great difficulty changed into rubber shoes; but even with their aid his lead of the section above was a brilliant piece of climbing. To my mind, it is the hardest bit of the ascent, and consists of an overhanging splayed-out chimney from the top of which it is necessary to step far out to the right. It is a long stride, the balance is critical, the handholds mere finger-scrapes, the exposure and the precipice beneath terrific. Only a man at the top of his form, with nerve and skill working in perfect unison, could safely make it.... Certainly those fifteen feet were overhanging; but more than fifteen feet of overhang were required to stop Longland at this stage. Personally, I had half-hoped that the previously considered and old-fashioned manoeuvre of 'swinging the leader', from the end of the ledge into the groove up which we had planned to go might be essential. Longland, however, settled the question in arbitrary fashion by clinging up the overhang – the solitary piece of pure gymnastics on the climb – and gaining the platform above.... Why describe the remainder of the great slab in detail? It is a job for the guidebook writers. No doubt every handhold and foothold will be earmarked and catalogued in the future because 1928 Anthology of Ascents 127 this route is unique so far as I know in Britain. ... In a year or so ladies will climb the West Buttress of Clogwyn Du'r Arddu and marvel at the difficulties we encountered." (F S Smythe)

"The outstanding event in 1928 was the first ascent of the West Buttress of Clogwyn Du'r Arddu, when the 'human flies' prophesied by the far-seeing author of the Snowdon Guide, materialised in the form of a very strong party headed by JL Longland and AS Pigott... A magnificent climb; its uniquely exposed situations, continuously high technical difficulty, absolute non-artificiality, and great length (450 feet make it almost the finest expedition in Wales." (CC Journal 1929)

"Sir, May I trespass on your valuable space to protest against Mr Kirkus's treatment of Clogwyn Du'r Arddu. Not content with climbing this cliff by a route hitherto deemed impossible, for which he has my respectful admiration, he must needs add insult to injury by giving this imposing precipice a regrettable if affectionate title. I find in the Helyg Log-book: 'June 16th. West Buttress of Cloggy. GGM and CFK.' The handwriting leaves no doubt as to the author... But Sir, Cloggy!" (CC Bulletin, November 1930)

The puritanical, piton-free climbing standards of Kirkus, Edwards and Birtwistle worked out in the Pass were at least the equal of free climbing standards on the Continent at that time. "Another incident I recall was when Gordon Dyke and I, returning from guidebook chores on other cliffs, happened along at the foot of the Grochan to find the unclimbed groove of Brant Direct still beating its would-be first ascent team by a clear ten feet. After two hard days of attack they had all but exhausted their arsenal of ironmongery, tactics and energy, so I asked if they would mind if I had a go. Without boring you with the details of some chalkless, nutless, though not completely protectionless free-climbing, I led it, having perceived that to get any pegs into the top crack would be very difficult whereas to hand-jam up it would be relatively easy. Gordon followed without too much trouble and this revitalised the originators of the climb so we brought up their captain, Pete Hodgkinson. I then fixed an abseil rope to descend and watch the others and was more than halfway down when a sudden cry from Hodge made me stop and look up, but it was just too late to avoid being hit. You've heard the expression 'p.d on from a great height'. Well, I was, en rappel, on Brant Direct!" P R J Harding The Climbers' Club Journal 1983 – transcript of after-dinner speech.

My mouth suddenly went dry and my hands started sweating - fear; an adrenalin-fix for the climbing junkie. 'If you can take in just a little faster than the speed at which I'm seconding, it would be appreciated.' " (P Williams)

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"...my own attempts from 1980 have been well wagged about. I call them The Tormented Ejaculation – not just mere climbing, but an expression of the flesh and blood of my work, the poetry of rock-movement inextricably bound up with the network of shape and colour. A last look at the line and a strange impulse took hold of me. I went for it. At 70 feet I woke up. Ghastly! The aggression was dissipated and fear gripped me. I had climbed with virtually no protection and was now eyeballing a tiny shallow crack. I remembered it from the abseil and it had looked pathetic. It was real now. I contemplated jumping on the scree below before the situation got out of control. I fell a million times, my arms unfolding, my breath fading. A No.1 stopper came to a halt, half-way down this crack, half in, rocking – my weight was on it... The mental preparation was becoming harder and harder. The so-called psyching-up, a pain beyond reason. Out of the acquaintance grew more and more fear. Gone the initial naivety which had sparked off this now terrifying enterprise. I knew the score and was unnerved by it... I distinctly felt a tiny slide on a friction move lower down and became very insecure, with my feet in Canyon boots. I got to the little crack another 20 feet up and was dangerously pumped because of the extra strain on my fingers. The resin was wearing off the boots. I managed to place an RP1, clipped in and was about to place a No.2 when my right foot shot off. The strain came on the RP, ripped it through, and I cartwheeled a long way down the wall." (John Redhead, High 1985.)

In 1982, John Redhead brought an up-to-date perspective to Cloggy's Great Wall saga with The Tormented Ejaculation at a mighty E8 7a, with a bolt marking the high-point of his bold explorations on one of the most celebrated lines in the country. Controversy was inevitable.

The bolt was chopped in 1983

The saga of the wall right of Great Wall continued with a very on-form Jerry Moffatt making a complete pitch climbing near Redhead's bolt placement on The Tormented Ejaculation before traversing right into Spreadeagle. The route was provocatively named Master's Wall.

After close abseil inspection, Moffatt chopped the bolt and climbed the pitch via a difficult escape right to Spreadeagle. Firé rock-boots make a dramatic entry to the UK! (P Williams)

"Moffatt chopped the Bolt – totally justified if it winked cheekily on his route, but it didn't. It shook with fear 10 feet off route on a totally different concept." (J Redhead, 1996)

"The original line of this route remains somewhat contentious as you can traverse right at various heights. Dawes, a witness of the first ascent, described Moffatt taking a lower line. One of the first ascent shots shows Moffatt at a point where a traverse right would certainly feel E7 by modern standards. What is clear is that Moffatt, having climbed some of the earliest 8a's in Britain by this point such as Oyster on Pen Trwyn, certainly had the capacity to climb harder. McHaffie, on his ascent, traversed right into Spreddeagle high on the wall at what he described as feeling like E8 or 9 in difficulty. I, on the other hand, was content with taking the lower E7 traverse! In truth, I feel this line has been superseded by its neighbour, but it still offers a historical and worrying lead." (C Muskett)

A belay bolt was placed above the roof. This has been removed since and a nut placement excavated beneath.

"Clipped into the belay bolt, I watched Johnny as the evening quickly slipped away. He couldn't seem to commit himself to the move above the poor peg, so I shouted up some encouragement. He went for it, snatching the creaking flake above, the crucial stopper I in his mouth. In the failing light he couldn't locate the placement. In extremis, he screamed, 'You've let me down, Dave, you bastard, you've let me down.' Like some TV game, macabre in concept, I played with Johnny's life, and talked his hand to the small hole for the runner." (D Towse)

Neil Dickson attempted the routes first on-sight ascent, taking a worrying fall onto a useful flake which later broke when he unweighted the rope. He returned to climb the route ground up in impressive style.

"I watched Caff attempt an on-sight having just warmed us up for the day on Authentic Desire. Every metre was hard won, the peg next to the first crux now likely poor and rusted; at the upper crux Caff came to a stop, going up and down before breaking a small hold on the crux and somehow tenaciously holding on and downclimbing to the protection. I dropped him a rope which was graciously accepted. I repeated the route sometime later and this can be regarded as a solid E8 nowadays – an impressive effort for 1984. The climbing is really tricky and there's a dearth of any reliable protection". (C Muskett)

The history of this route, more than any in the latter part of the twentieth century, marks some of the greatest efforts in British climbing; and the associated passion, heart and spirit that has been invested here has led to real risk, drama, loss, tragedy, success, and euphoria.

"I went for the crux, the motion startling me like a car unexpectedly in gear in a crowded parking lot. I swarm through the roundness of the bulge to a crank on a brittle spike for a cluster of three crystals on the right; each finger crucial and separate like the keys for a piano chord. I change feet three times to rest my lower legs, each time having to jump my foot out to put my other in. The fingerholds are too poor to hang on should the toes catch on each other. All those foot-changing mistakes on easy moves by runners come into my mind. There is no resting, I must go and climb for the top. I swarm up towards the sunlight, gasping for air. A brittle hold holds under mistreatment and then I really blow it; fearful of a smear on now non-sticky boots I use an edge and move up, a fall now fatal. But the automaton stabs back through, wobbling but giving its all, and I grasp a large sidepull and tube upward, the ropes dangling uselessly from my waist. Arthur Birtwistle on Diagonal, I grasp incuts and the vectors recede. The Indian Face is climbed and I can rest and feel proud. Longland's, the Drainpipe Crack, Troach, Great Wall, and Midsummer's smile in me again, but like fine antiques in the gallery."
